for applicants in ICANN's New gTLD Program: Next Round.

ICANN is seeking pro bono professional service providers and mentors who would like to volunteer their expertise to Applicant Support Program (ASP) applicants and new gTLD applicants, with priority given to applicants that have qualified for the ASP.

The ASP provides assistance to entities that want to apply for a gTLD but that lack the financial or technical resources to do so. The program offers lower evaluation fees, access to volunteer professional services, and capacity development training.

- Expand your visibility and influence within the multi-billion-dollar Domain Name System industry.
- Help create opportunities for underserved communities.

How will supported applicants find you?

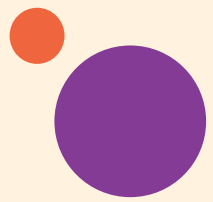

What types of services are needed?

ICANN seeks volunteers who can offer applicants a variety of services and in particular, those who offer these services in languages beyond English to support diverse applicants.

Pro Bono Professional Service Providers

Pro bono service providers offer volunteer hours for professional services related to their technical, legal, translation, and general business areas of expertise, including:

General Business Services



Supporting business plan development, creating marketing plans, providing guidance on operationalizing a gTLD, translation, financial, and/or legal services.

Application Services



Guidance in developing a comprehensive, complete, and competitive gTLD application; writing and submitting an application.

Technical Services



Help in navigating the technical requirements of a gTLD application and ongoing infrastructure necessary to run a registry.

Mentors

Mentors volunteer their time to provide perspective and guidance based upon personal experience within the community or industry, such as:

Industry Experience



Guidance on different types of business models to consider and other areas of running a registry.

ICANN Knowledge



Unbiased advice on how to participate in ICANN's multistakeholder community.

Application Assistance



Insights gained from experience navigating the gTLD application process and DNS industry.
